We will keep going.

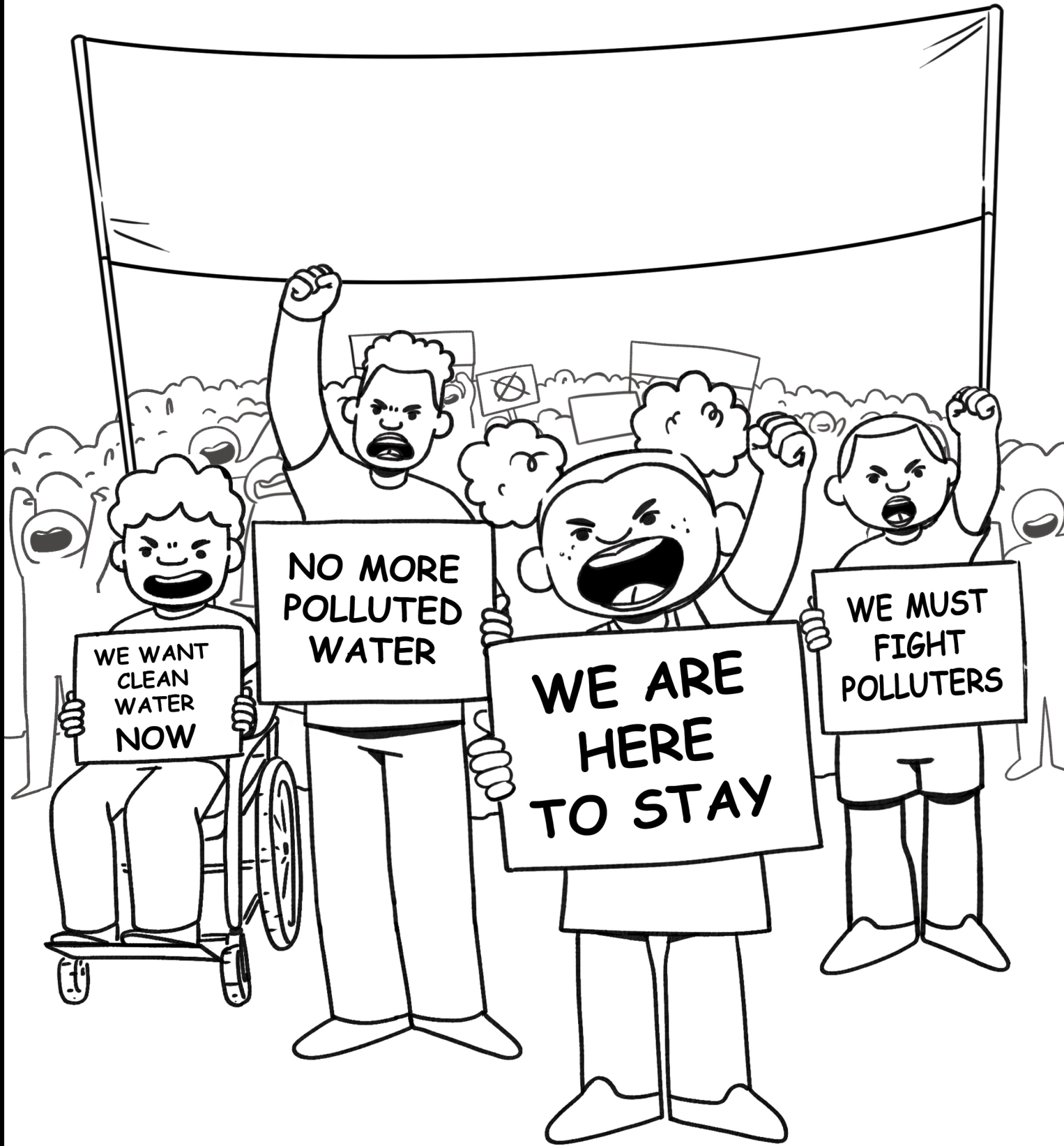
We will keep fighting.

Someday, we'll have clean water to drink again.

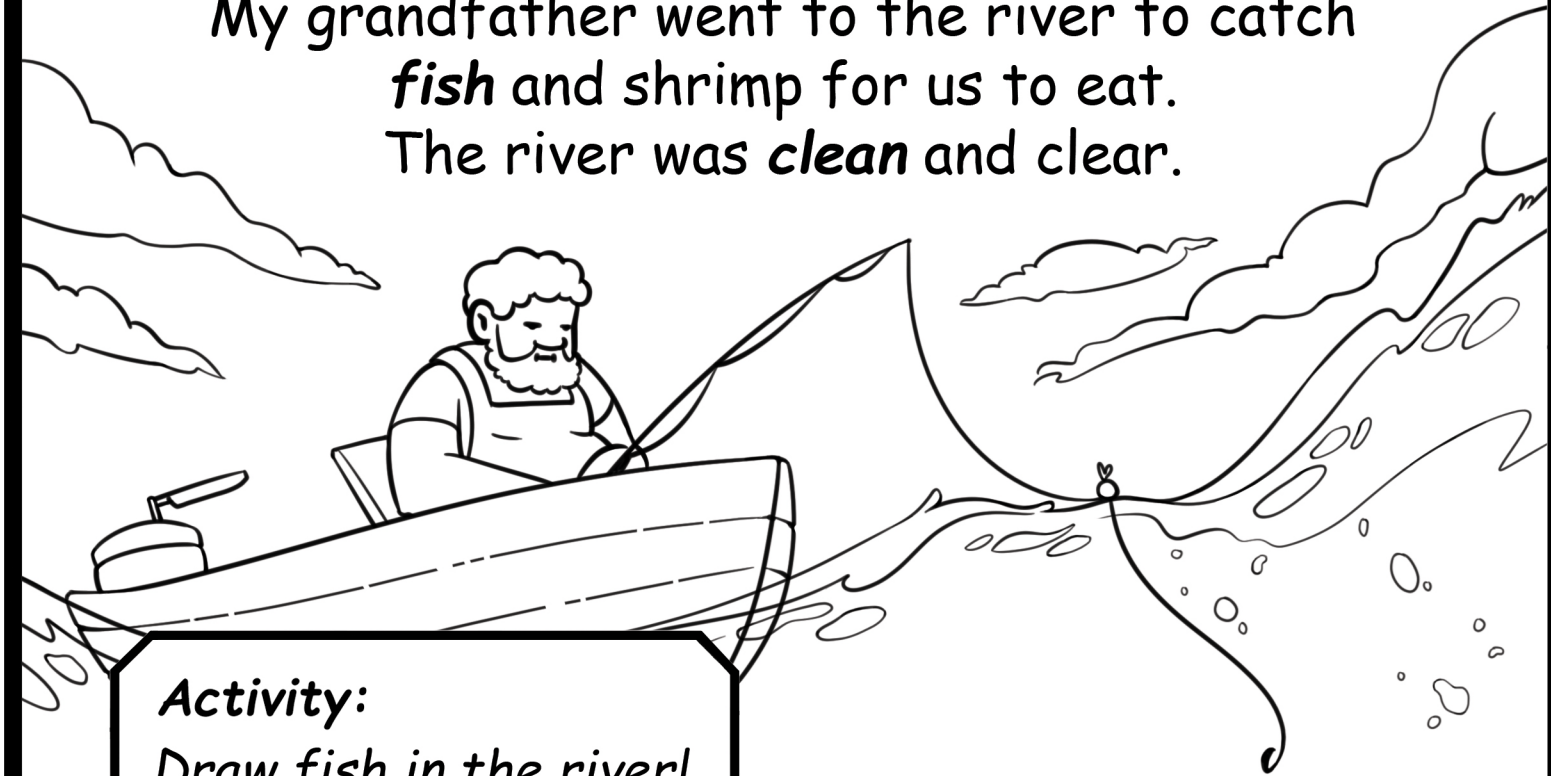
Someday, our river will be clear and beautiful.

Draw a protest sign or write what you believe.

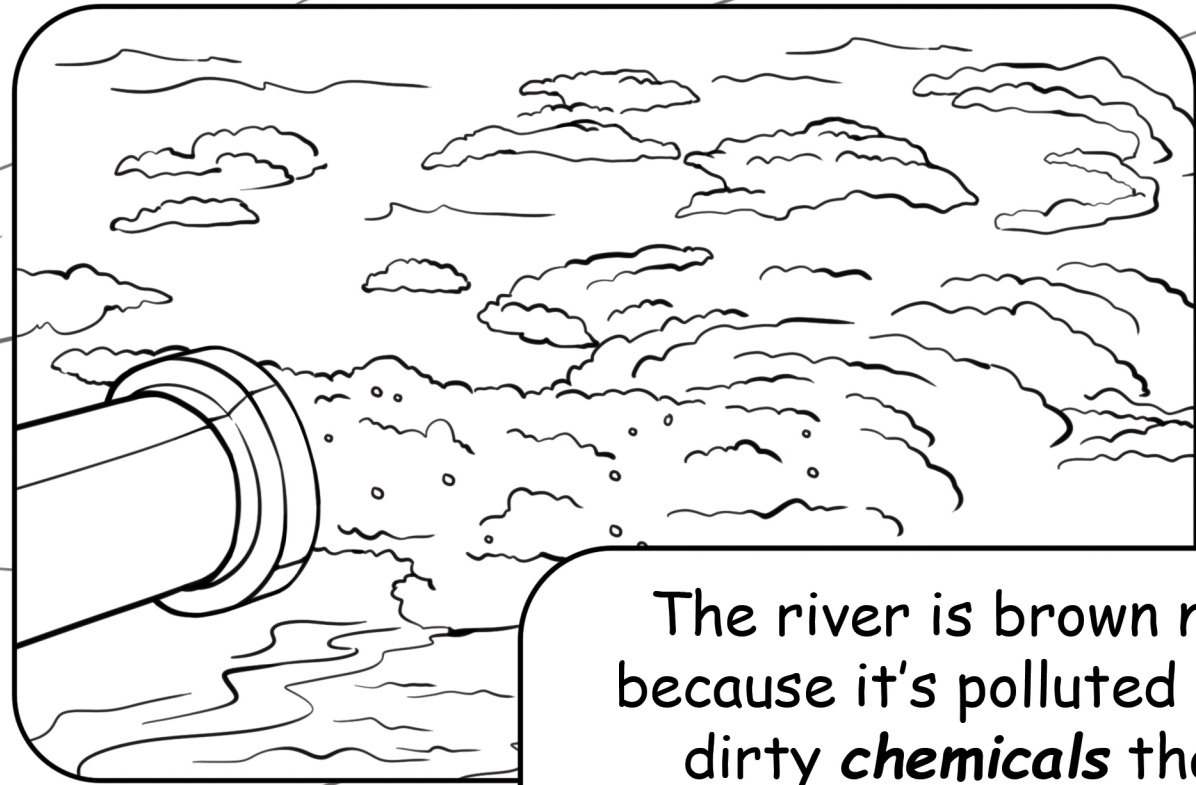


When I was a young girl, the river was beautiful.

Draw fish in the river!



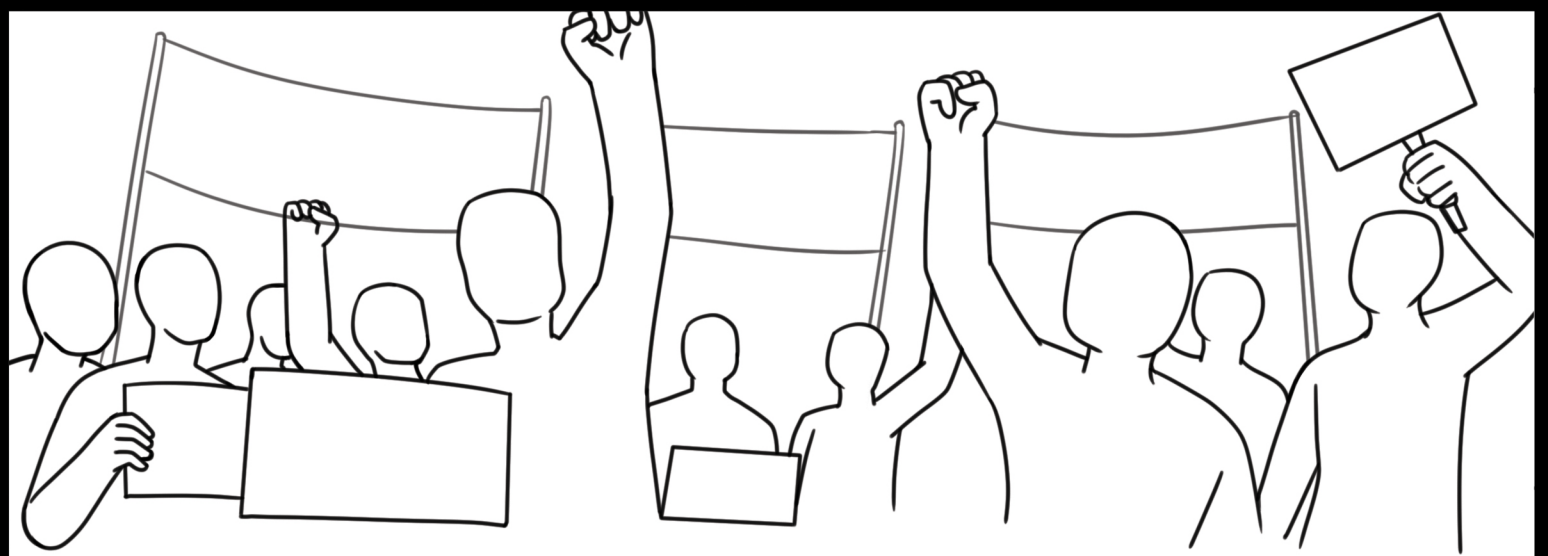


The river is brown now because it's polluted with dirty **chemicals** that make the **water** unsafe. Those chemicals in the water make people sick.

First, we pray, which gives us strength, courage, and connection to God.

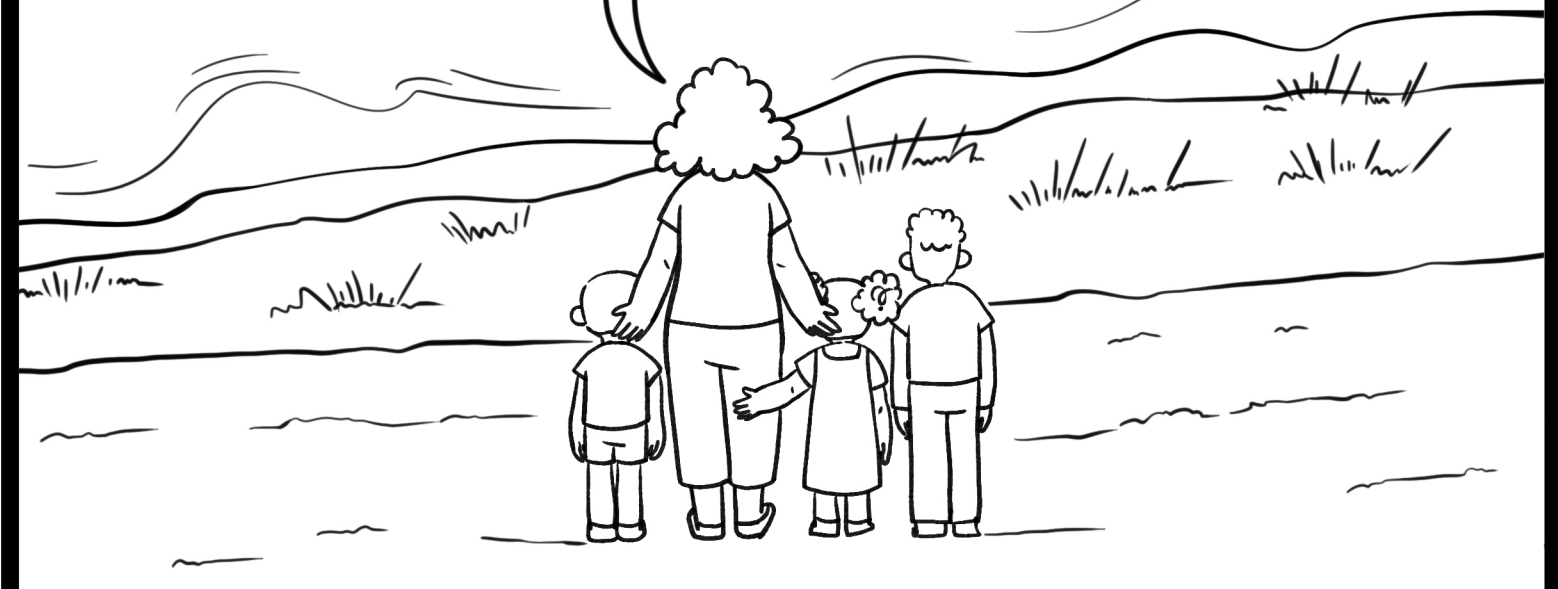
Then, we *organize* with our neighbors and make a plan together to stop pollution.
